Salish Sea Expeditions Scholarships

High School Summer Seminars

SEA is proud to offer scholarships to motivated high school students who have completed an expedition with Salish Sea Expeditions. One merit-based scholarship will be awarded, based on academic achievement and educational experience, for each of the following SEA Summer Seminars:

- Science at SEA (SAS), \$300
- Oceanography of the Southern California Bight (OSCB), \$500

The Programs

SEA offers an interdisciplinary curriculum, on shore and at sea aboard tall ships, that provides challenging voyages of scientific discovery, academic rigor, and personal growth. SEA Summer Seminars are open to high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors.

Science at SEA (SAS) is a 20-day program focusing on the coastal and offshore marine environment around Cape Cod, Massachusetts, with a shore component on the SEA campus in Woods Hole, MA, and a sea component aboard one of SEA's sailing research vessels, the SSV Corwith Cramer.

Oceanography of the Southern California Bight (OSCB) is a 3-week program focused on the marine environments of the California coast. OSCB takes place on Catalina Island at the University of Southern California's Wrigley Institute for Environmental Studies (WIES) and aboard SEA's research sailing vessel, the SSV Robert C. Seamans.
